



Drug & Alcohol Policy

Barfoot & Thompson Stadium (the Stadium) complies with the Liquor licensing authority and prohibits the serving or supply of alcohol to intoxicated or under age persons.

No alcohol is to be consumed on the site without permission

Intoxicated or under age persons who are identified with alcohol will be asked to leave the premises.

The Stadium maintains a strict “no drugs” policy. Any person identified as being in possession or having drugs will be asked to leave the premises.

Incidents involving drugs or alcohol will be referred to the Police immediately for the safety of our guests and our staff. Failure to leave the premises or comply with requests may result in the immediate termination of your event as per our terms and conditions.

Hosting a licensed or unlicensed event

Whether your event is private or open to the public, a license to sell, supply or consume alcohol is generally required. There are a few exceptions where a license is not required, however the stadium recommends that in all instances where alcohol is being consumed you apply for a license or engage a catering company that has a license. You can apply for a special one-off license through the council. There are considerations that are required for the sale and or supply of alcoholic beverages. As part of our terms and conditions (11.2), you are required to act within all laws and regulations. Failure to comply with these laws will result in the immediate cessation of the event.

There are a number of tools available online to assist you in planning responsible service of alcohol at your event. We recommend you develop an alcohol management plan for your event. Templates are available at the following site:

Please discuss your alcohol management plan with one of our event coordinators prior to your event. The stadium may at its discretion elect to engage security personnel at the cost of the client if the management plan is not in place.
